


#### Singing with 'magic lips'


Singing lyrics in your head and doing the actions at the same time. What we call 'singing with magic lips' encourages children to concentrate, observe and learn the words.

Ride ride ride your bike up and down the road Swerve right, hold on tight! You nearly squashed a toad.. ribbet



### **Percussion** to add texture

Change the pace of the song (tempo) to give atmosphere and drama. Use dynamics to quietly sail and loudly rock and splash. Show a collection of instruments and explore which instruments can be played during the song.

Children can choose instruments for the different 'waters' and for the crocodile.

For example: cymbals for the splash, scraping guiro for hoisting the sails and castanets or claves for the snapping crocodile.

There are many songs that you can sing with the squirble and a piece of lycra.



Working together, children push and pull the lycra, then sway it side to side, lifting it up for the sails

#### A Partner song

- 1. Sitting opposite each other, children hold hands, pushing and pulling as they start to row their boat.
- 2. They carry on rowing until they pull up and down to hoist the sail and shout out the pirate's cry
- 3. Sailing out to sea with their arms in the air, they sway from side to side as they sail their boat.
- 4. As the sea gets choppy, they start to rock from side to side, falling sideways with a splash.
- 5. Sitting up quickly, they hold hands, rowing faster to avoid the crocodiles with a loud scream.
